A Global Cultural Center in the Midwest

Framed by stunning Lake Michigan and decorated with inspiring architecture, Chicago is more than just a big-city. Besides its striking downtown area, which includes some of the tallest and architecturally celebrated buildings in the world, Chicago has a distinctive shoreline, hundreds of vibrant parks and 77 unique neighborhoods. Chicago has been named the "Best Big City in the U.S." by Condé Nast Traveler and "The World's Best City for Having It All" by Time Out, among other numerous awards.

Chicago's neighborhoods represent more than 100 countries, and it is through this diversity and profound city culture that we are able to develop the country's best restaurants, theaters, and museums. With incredible shopping on the Magnificent Mile, world premiere performances in its famed Theater District and one of the country's most active nightlife scenes, the city is always buzzing. Chicago also features more than 60 museums, five regional Tony-award winning theaters and no matter the season, there is always a professional sports team to cheer to victory.

It is this truly distinctive mix of incredible attractions and cultural allure that makes Chicago one of the friendliest, most livable cities in America.



Center of It All

Situated squarely in the center of the country, getting to and around Chicago - by plane, train or automobile - is easy thanks to two international airports, reliable public transit, and a wealth of accessible travel options.

Two World Class Airports:

Chicago boasts two world-class airports with nearly 3,000 daily inbound and outbound flights, making it one of the most accessible cities in the world. Both airports are close to downtown and are easily accessible with public and private transportation: O'Hare International Airport (17 miles from downtown) and Midway International Airport (15 miles from downtown). Chicago's prime location in the center of the country makes for short domestic flights for out of town guests to join NASPE festivities.

Connected Transportation Network:

Downtown, known as the Loop, serves as the hub of Chicago's vast public transit network that extends to surrounding neighborhoods and suburbs. This network includes downtown's Chicago Transit Authority (CTA) and the suburban Metra rail.

"L" Trains:

Eight light-rail "L" lines serve more than 145 stations all over town, including stops at O'Hare and Midway airports.

Buses, Taxis, and Ride-Sharing:

129 bus routes lace the City; buses stop every few blocks and have mounted maps within the cab. Several lines operate 24 hours, and customers can access a trip planning tool and bus tracker app on TransitChicago.com. Taxis are plentiful, easy to hail in downtown and offer a convenient way to get around the City. Ride-sharing app customers can easily find designated pickup and drop-off locations.

Bike Sharing:

Chicago's Divvy bike sharing program is an inexpensive and easy way to get around the City. Thousands of bikes are available at hundreds of stations across the City.

Waterfront

Museums and Culture


